Action on Vermont dams this year!

West Branch of the Passumpsic River, West Burke, VT:

This old dam, so-called, Browns Mill is slated for removal in August. MadDog TU is involved in riparian plantings and site work post removal. You'll be asked to help out!

Jail Branch in Washington Village:

This former mill site dam removal is being managed by the Winooski River Conservation District. There are many partners including TU, VT F&W, Friends of the Winooski, The Town of Washington. Removal likely in 2022.

<u>Dog River in the Village of Northfield:</u>

This is the so-called "Cross Brothers" dam. The site is adjacent to Dollar General. There are studies being done now and funding being sought for this project. Plant in Lyndonville on May 4th and 5th! This is sponsored by the Passumpsic Valley Land Trust. When: May 4-5. Time: 9:00 am to 4:00 pm

<u>Simplified Vermont Fishing Regulations:</u>

Vermont Fish and Wildlife requested new regs and they have gotten through the 2nd vote by the Vermont Fish and Wildlife Board. The Board approved. The 3rd and final vote is in June. There are major changes. These include, basically no closed trout season on the majority of Vermont waters. From November 1 to the 2nd Saturday in April it would be catch and release with artificial lures and flies only. A couple of exceptions would be for the Dog River and the Battenkill. Closed seasons stay in place here. Another major change, **finally**, a reduction in the daily brook limit. This would go from 12 to 8. Browns and rainbows from 6 to 8. You see the simplification trend here. (The Vermont Council of TU is on record stating the need to further reduce the brook trout limit to 6).

Introduction to Fly Fishing for Women:

In 2022 MadDog TU plans to start an annual introduction to fly fishing for women. This event was initially planned for the Summer of 2020. Well we know what happened then. Next years event plans to fill in a "reel" need for more diversity on the water!
